Class 7 (English) 2. Into Thin Air Sec.1 The Inexperienced Ghost

Summary:-

This particular extract is taken from 'The Story of the Inexperienced Ghost' written by H.G Wells. In this a man, Clayton is narrating an incident of his encounter with a ghost that took place the last night at a club. He is narrating all this to his friends Wish, Sanderson, Evans and the narrator of this lesson. Clayton tells his friends who have come to meet him at the club, how he met a ghost last night. Initially they did not believe Clayton and made fun of him, but they seemed to believe him when he gave detailed description about the ghost. He told the ghost was transparent. He was lean and had a small head with very short hair. He was wearing a short jacket and trousers which were frayed at the heels. On being asked by Clayton, the ghost told him that he had come there to haunt the place. In response to this, Clayton scolded him and said that that was not the right place for the ghosts to haunt as people stay there with their children. It might scare the kids. The ghost said that he did not want to come to that place. In fact he wanted to return back from the club but he couldn't because he had forgotten the last set of moves that would help him to go back from there. Clayton helped the ghost by encouraging him to keep trying until he gets to the correct moves. Finally he got the moves right and succeeded in returning back to the place from where he had come. Yet, Clayton's friends did not believe him completely. So to convince them Clayton told them that he could replicate the moves which the ghost was doing to disappear from there. And he began to do that. Wish was very afraid as he thought this would really make Clayton

disappear from there if he copied the moves correctly. Clayton kept trying the moves. His friends were getting tensed. And when he made his last gesture which could vanish him, he said NO because he was just telling a story to them. He had not met any ghost that night.

C. Answer the questions:-

Q.1 "The mess he had made of haunting had saddened him terribly." Who had made a mess of haunting? How had he done it? Why was he sad?
