- 1. Why did Swaminathan try to carry cricket scores in his head? What does his tell you about him?
 - Ans. Swaminathan tried to carry cricket scores in his head because his friend did so. He wanted to show that he enjoyed cricket like his friend.
- 2. What did Swaminathan think about the pictures of cricket players? Why did he collect them?
